# Resource Specialist Job Description

### **DEFINITION**

To provide an educational program for pupils who are learning disabled in relation to their ability and who exhibit behavioral, physical, neurological and/or emotional problems of such severity that success cannot be expected in the regular classroom without help.

## **ESSENTIAL DUTIES**

- x Providing direct or collaborative instructional services to identified students in the resource specialist program as developed in each student's IEP.
- x Coordinating of the resource specialist program at the school site, or sites, including supervision and direction of those instructional aides assigned.
- x Monitoring of pupil progress on a regular basis and referring of pupils who do not demonstrate appropriate progress.
- x Insuring that the emphasis at the secondary school level is an academic achievement, career and vocational development, and preparation for adult life.
- x Maintaining appropriate student records as required.
- x Providing consultation, resource information, and material regarding individuals with exceptional needs to their parents and to regular staff members.
- x Counseling students on all aspects of life.
- x Coordinating special education services with the regular school program for each individual with exceptional needs enrolled in Resource Specialist program.
- x Assisting in staff development activities at local schools as appropriate.
