At-Risk Counselor Job Description

DEFINITION

The At-Risk Counseling Program is designed to provide supplementary counseling services to identified pupils who are not earning credits at a rate which will enable the student to graduate with the rest of his/her class. The program will ensure that each student, upon reaching age sixteen or prior to the end of the tenth grade, whichever occurs first, will receive a systematic review of his/her academic progress and the proper counseling regarding educational options available to the student. The At-Risk Counselor will ensure that each identified student receives assistance in social, academic or personal regretation of individualized test scores
